APPROVED: 5-0 by roll call vote. Motion to award Stardust Building Supply with the 2026 Sustainable Scottsdale Award by Commissioner Craig; 2ND by Commissioner Brady. Vice Chair McMahon, and Commission Members Brady, Craig, Iyengar, and Waxelbaum, voted in the affirmative; there were no dissenting votes.

APPROVED: 5-0 by roll call vote. Motion to 1) Direct the Commission Liaison to notify Stardust Building Supply by email and transmit a formal letter conveying the Commission's recognition; 2) Request that the City Clerk schedule time at a future City Council meeting, preferably the meeting closest to Earth Day, to publicly acknowledge Stardust Building Supply for this recognition; and 3) Authorize Commissioner Craig to present the award at a future City Council meeting, with the specific date to be determined by Commissioner Craig; 2nd by Commissioner Brady. Vice Chair McMahon, and Commission Members Brady, Craig, Iyengar, and Waxelbaum, voted in the affirmative; there were no dissenting votes.

* 4. **Solid Waste Services Update**

The Commission will receive a presentation from Scottsdale's Solid Waste Services, including an update on the Food Waste Diversion at City Venues Study (FY 24/25 pilot program), the Old Town Scottsdale Business Recycling Pilot Program (including the current status of recycling throughout Old Town/downtown Scottsdale), and general departmental information last presented to SEAC in December 2023. The Commission will also receive information on additional Solid Waste Services efforts that may be relevant to the Commission's advisory role including residential and commercial refuse and recycling programs, bulk and brush collection, transfer station operations, fleet, current initiatives, the ADEQ Recycling Grant, and future plans and programs.

Commissioner Craig informed the Commission of a potential future agenda item to invite a representative from Goodwill of Central and Northern Arizona to provide an update on the monitored donation container project. She noted that the project has been operating in a pilot phase since October 2025 in partnership with another municipality, and that initial data is now available. She further indicated that two additional containers are currently being fabricated and that the original units will be returned for updates. The Commission expressed general support for receiving a presentation on this item.

Commissioner Waxelbaum raised an additional potential agenda topic regarding changes to the certification of an advanced water purification facility. He noted that the facility previously held a high-level certification that is reportedly no longer valid and that regaining compliance may require significant upgrades. He expressed interest in receiving an informational presentation from the City’s Water Resources Department to better understand the nature of the change, including whether it is the result of updated requirements from the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) or other regulatory factors.
