PUBLIC COMMENT – Written Comment Cards

Written comment cards are being accepted for both agendized and non-agendized items and may be submitted to City staff at any time. Cards submitted after public testimony has begun will be provided to the Parks and Recreation Commission at the conclusion of the testimony for that item.

PUBLIC COMMENT – Non-Agendized Items

Citizens may address the members of the Parks and Recreation Commission during Public Comment. Public comment time is reserved at the beginning of the meeting for citizens to comment on an item that is not on the prepared agenda. Public comment is limited to the discussion of items that are within the Commission's jurisdiction and is limited to a total of 15 minutes. Arizona state law prohibits the Parks and Recreation Commission from discussing or taking action on these non-agendized items. Citizens may complete one Request to Speak "Public Comment" card per meeting and submit it to City staff. Public testimony is limited to **three (3) minutes per speaker**.
