Public comment is limited to the discussion of items that are within the Commission’s jurisdiction and is limited to a total of 15 minutes. Arizona state law prohibits the Parks and Recreation Commission from discussing or taking action on these non-agendized items. Citizens may complete one Request to Speak “Public Comment” card per meeting and submit it to City staff. Public testimony is limited to **three (3) minutes per speaker.**
