## MAYOR'S REPORT - None

### **ACTING CITY MANAGER'S REPORT**

Acting City Manager Brian Biesemeyer explained that Artisan Markets' 2015/2016 Special Event Permit was limited to the 2015 dates, pending Council's consideration of a citizen petition on October 6. On October 16, Artisan Markets received notice that the 2016 dates had been denied. Mr. Biesemeyer said, based on Council direction, he also conducted a review to determine if any further action was required regarding the 2015 dates. Part of the review included two meetings with Artisan Markets. After these meetings, Artisan Markets agreed to eliminate all Thursday night events after November 12. The other aspects of the permit will remain in place for the remaining 2015 dates.

**PUBLIC COMMENT** – Scott Eubanks and French Thompson commented on tourism and special events. Betty Drake spoke on the Arizona Central Project sites.

- Complexities in identifying resources


# Tourism Plan Update

- To date a total of \$104,936 has been expended






# Through Vehicles versus Left-turning Vehicles


## **TEN MAJOR SCOTTSDALE INTERSECTIONS**
