CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Lisa Borowsky called to order a Regular Meeting of the Scottsdale City Council at 5:02 P.M. on Tuesday, January 14, 2025 in the City Hall Kiva Forum.

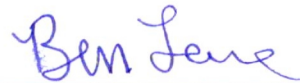

1. Seven (7) members with financial, accounting, business or government management experience
2. Each Councilmember to appoint one member
3. Mayor to appoint member to serve as Chair
4. Members have 3-year terms
