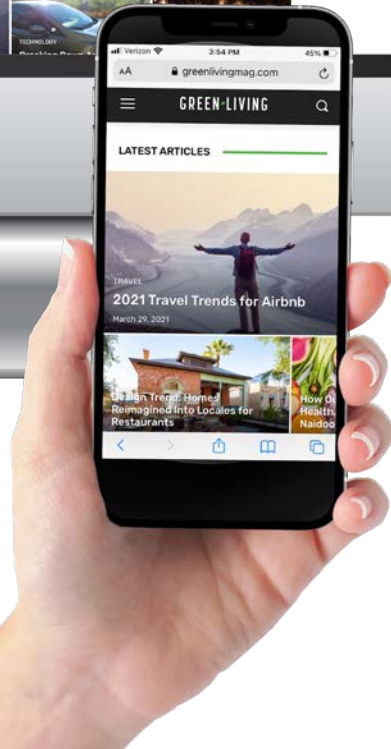
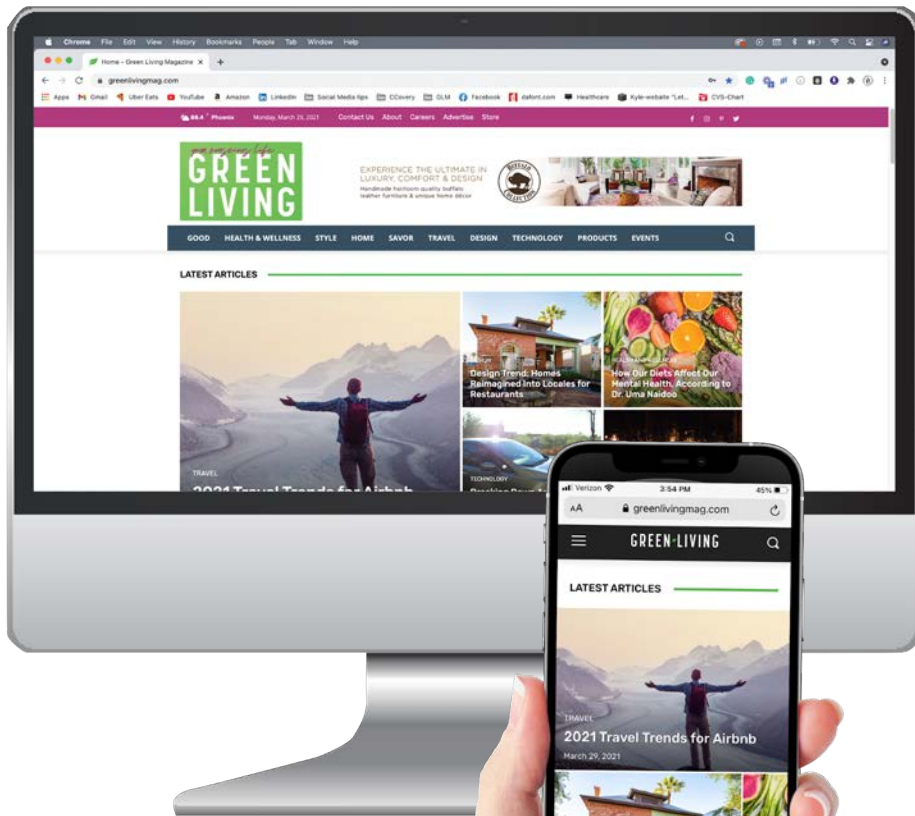

Laundry Room



- Ditch the chemicals in your laundry room!
- Switch to all-natural cleaners made from local vendors. Try Truce Products or Eco Mama Clean.
- Mix in vinegar with your laundry soap instead of using dryer sheets.
- Switch to a front-loader washing machine. It uses half the water of a top loader.
- DIY vinegar and water with citrus fruits.
- Tip: Wash your clothes on cold. This can eliminate 1600 pounds of carbon emissions a year.

Bedroom



- Organic Living, Brooklyn Bedding

- Buy furniture that does not have toxins and chemicals. Instead, invest in an organic mattress.
- Cotton is the world's dirtiest crop... make the switch to organic cotton sheets (and clothes). Leading cause in air and water pollution 60% of cotton plant goes into our food stream feed and seed

Beauty and Cosmetics



- Find products that are natural and packaged using as little waste as possible.
- We do men, Dr.Bonner's
- If beauty products come in jars, reuse the jars.

Beauty and Cosmetics



Tip: Check for nano-titanium dioxide. These harmful chemicals can get into the water supply and harm our natural environment.

- Choose a natural, organic hair coloring.
- Swap your perfume for essential oils.
- Try brands like Quench Natural and Peak Scents.
- Use a bamboo toothbrush and a natural toothpaste that is sustainably packaged. Toothpaste containers in landfill



Living Room & Dining Room

- Swap out your carpet with wood bamboo or cork flooring.
- Live plants potted in soil can clean indoor air of toxic substances.
- Window tinting to keep the heat out and lower energy bills. Heat reduction is up to 80%
- Get an energy audit by For Energy switch to LED lights.
- Tip: Turn off your lights, it can save you can save 60% carbon dioxide.





Paint & Pesticides

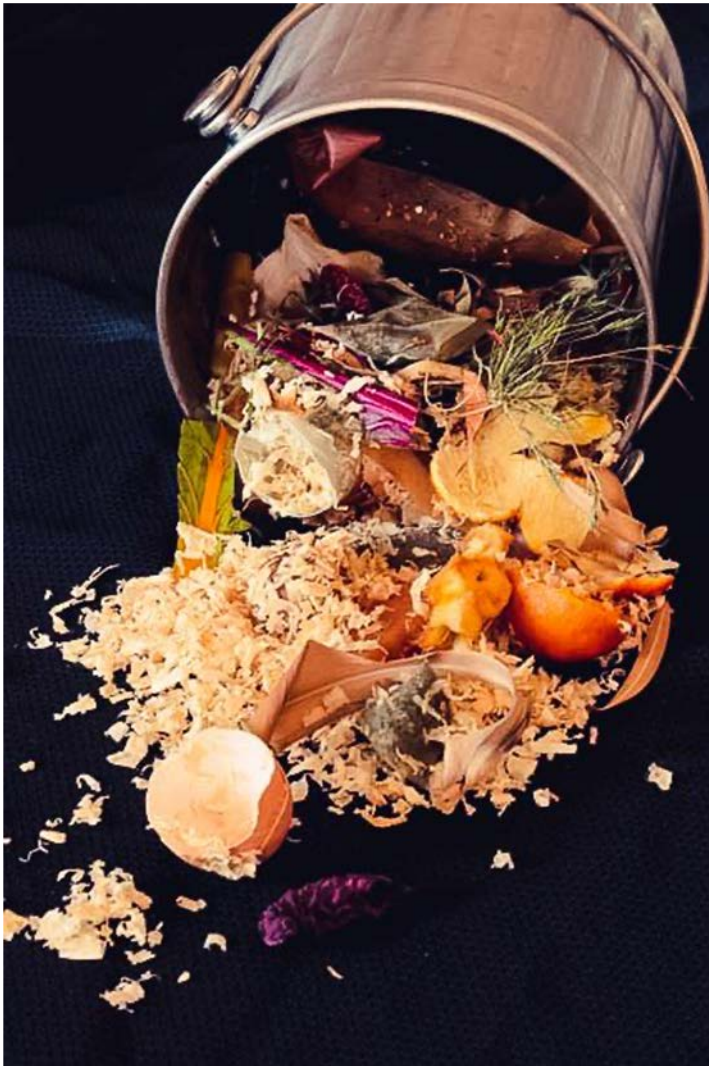
- Paint your walls using non-VOC paint.
(Volatile organic compounds are compounds that have a high vapor pressure and low water solubility.)
- Use eco-friendly pesticides to eliminate harsh chemicals.
Green organic pest control
- Don't throw away your paint. Let the professionals handle it. City of Scottsdale hazardous waste
(Companies like Green Sheen, Lowe's, Habitat for Humanity, accept leftover paint in order to recycle it.)

Kitchen



- I am a pescatarian but limiting my fish because the globally the fisheries are overtaxed.
- Use your excess water to water your plants.
- Instead of using plastic Tupperware, switch to glass containers and jars.
- Wash your fruits and vegetables with vinegar and water.
- Ditch water bottles. How long do you think it takes for a water bottle to biodegrade?
- Reuse jars and bottles, Terracycle

Kitchen



- Use cookware made out of copper stainless or cast-Iron Stoneware.
- Do not pre rinse your dishes! It wastes water and time.
- Bosch Dishwasher that uses less water and energy. Bosch energy star refrigerator.
- Compost fruits and vegetable. (Recycled City for compost \$17).
- Ditch paper towels MIT researchers found that it release 70% more carbon emissions than air drying.

- 80 billion pieces of clothing are consumed globally every year.
- The volume of water consumed by apparel production each year is currently the equivalent of 32 million Olympic swimming pools.
- The fashion industry emits 10% of total greenhouse gas emissions.
- Globally 12% of clothes are recycled.
- Have a clothing swap or join Swap Society.
- Buy from brands like Yes And & Seed to Style, Chasor and Activ Intimates.
- All clothes were swapped or made with organic cotton from brands above.

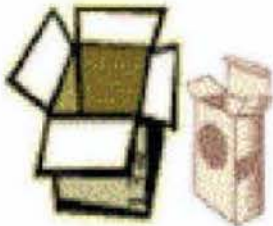

No Facial or Toilet Tissue, Paper Towels, Paper Plates, Napkins, Gift Wrap, Diapers, Pet Food Bags, FedEx or Self-sealing Envelopes



Plastics

All plastic cups and containers #1-7, plastic bottles, jugs, jars, yogurt containers, cottage cheese containers, margarine and whipped topping tubs, "Clamshell" food containers and disposable plastic cups, including plastic bottle caps

No Plastic Bags *, Motor Oil or Pool Chemical Containers or Styrofoam

*** Clear plastic bags can be used to contain shredded paper.**

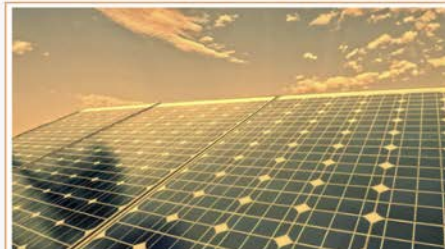
Parks & Trees

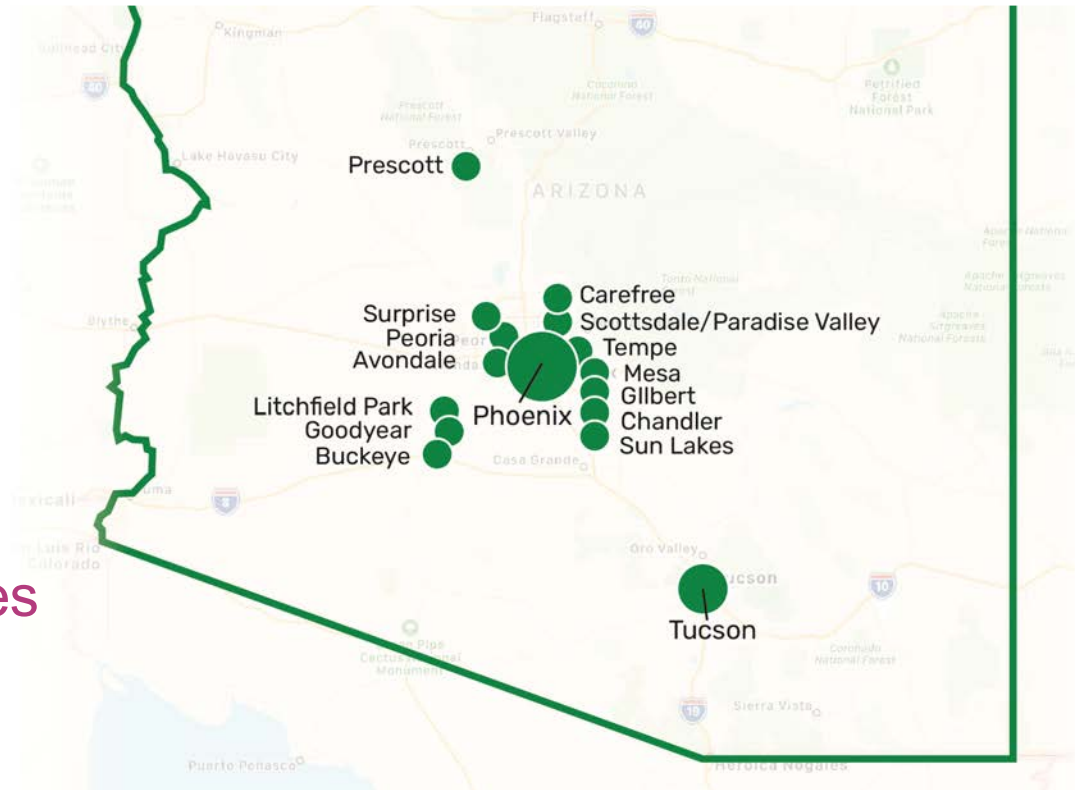
